As you read our special Lighthouse News and our 2011 In Review insert...may you hear your heart echo, "Look at what the Lord has done!!"



# Community Care

In 2011 we restructured our ministries to prepare for the changes coming in 2012. Part of this process included capturing the essence of what we do in the labeling of ministry flow. The department of *Community Care* was developed and the role of staff and the men who serve our guests transitioned as well.

Within the *Community Care* department are all the "first touch" ministries addressing the needs of those still trapped in the homelessness cycle: *Safe Area, Fresno Medical Respite Center* (our newest ministry, established July 2011), *Overnight Shelter for Men*, and *General Services* (Clothing Warehouse, Mail Services, Messages and Community Bulletin Board.)

## Transforming Life Programs

Transformation takes place when first the mind is renewed (Romans 12:2.) Program alone is not enough. The Academy and Samaritan Women's programs offer tremendous lifeskills and work experience training for men and women who are transitioning from a life of addiction and pain. At the heart of all we do and say is Christ. Not all who first enter our programs make it. More than half will drop out before the end of their first quarter. Total life change is not easy, but it is necessary in overcoming the obstacles they now face. Our doors and services remain open to receive them when they finally reach rock bottom.

## Transition & Triumph

When men and women successfully navigate the residential portions of our recovery programs, they transition into Aftercare, the last phase before completion. Typically this is the point of their program when they reunite with their families. By the time they reach this point in the program, our hope is that they have made monumental strides, achieved miraculous results, and traversed far beyond the scope any program could ever hope to offer had Christ not been present. Here are just a sampling of the things Christ can do that we cannot.

There were **78 men** and **9 women who entered** *Career Employment Services*. Of these, **70 men** and **7 women** completed this mandatory 4th quarter curriculum. **184 women** were served through the *Clothing Closet*, **40** for Job Search or Interviews.

Of these, **55 men** and **7 women** found gainful employment. Additionally, **10 men** and **1 woman** entered adult education or college (**6** are working *and* going to school.)

Through Samaritan Women, **14 men and 44 women graduated** *Parenting Class* (a court recognized and mandated program.)

Education plays a major roll in navigating a successful program. There were 45 men and 2 women enrolled in GED. There were also 18 men enrolled in Literacy. Many were so low in their scholastic abilities when they began, they continued on with their classes beyond the length of our programs. Of those who completed the studies within 18 months, 6 men received their GED and 4 others are still taking their tests toward completion.

There are four specific goals we set for our program participants:

- Having a vibrant relationship with Jesus Christ
- Conquering their addictions
- Restoration with their families
- Becoming productive members of society



In 2011, **40 men** and **4 women were baptized** either at the Mission or in their own church, and roughly **25 men** and **123 women made recommitments** to the Lord. (These statistics include outpatient program through Samaritan Women.)

BattleZONE, a program introduced into the Academy in 2010, deeply enhances the fight against addictions through discipleship and training. In its first full year, 66 men completed BattleZONE (half of whom went through it more than once, and of these, 8 men became BattleZONE coaches.

In October 2011, **48 men** and **2 women received their certificate of completion** of the 18 month program during our Annual Fall Celebration Banquet.

## Our Faithful Community



In 2011, the people of our community rallied behind every challenge we put before them. The outpouring of care and support continues forward into 2012. We couldn't do what we do without you. Together, we are making a difference! Here is just a sampling of the individuals sharing their time to make what we do better.

Through Samaritan Women, 144 volunteers (average per month) logged in 6832 hours of volunteer time in 2011! Volunteers in this snapshot consisted of mentors, tutors and instructors. There were also 70+ Pen Pals encouraging women behind bars with 917 pieces of correspondence - and a total of 517 jail visits by volunteers.

Through the **Academy**, an average of **92 volunteer mentors**, **teachers and tutors** logged in roughly **3650 hours** of service in 2011. In **Food Services and Community Care**, our schools, groups, service organizations and individuals (supporting special events and daily ministry activities on Mission property) averaged **71 volunteers** per month and **5190 service hours**. In total, the Fresno Rescue Mission had the help of **over 1100 individuals** in 2011! Amazing!

### LOOKING FORWARD

God's timing is always perfect. We anticipate the opening of Rescue the Children during the second quarter of 2012. The renovation should be completely paid for by the opening date. The next challenge is to continue to raise the additional \$1.2 million it will take to run the community each year. We are on our way towards this goal, but would love to have your help.

Case management has become an important factor in all our ministries, including our Overnight Shelter for Men. The goal in 2012 will be to help homeless men find what they need to re-engage in the community quickly, rather than being stuck in the cycle of homelessness. Community Care – Transitioning men from homelessness, back to the community.

The Mission is always looking for new ways to help the needy of our community, engaging in partnerships with other local organizations, but always keeping first things first... our relationship with Christ as the foundation of all we do. Can't wait to see what God does in 2012!
